Year 1 In English this week we created a story map based on our class story "Puffin Peter", we first put our pictures in the correct order and started to write captions to retell the story. In computing, we have worked really hard on our keyboard skills, we played a fun fireworks game trying to find the letter to make the firework explode. In Art, we looked at observational drawings of shells, we enjoyed looking at the different sizes and shapes of the shells.

This week, Year 2 have been continuing their learning about instructions. We thought about what makes somebody a good friend and wrote descriptive sentences about a good friend. Next week, we will be writing instructions on how to be a good friend. In art, we completed a 'feely drawing'. We were given an object which we held behind our backs and had to draw. We imagined what it looked like without seeing what the object was.















In Reception we have been reading a variety of stories, showcasing the wonderful diversity of our school community. This has given us the opportunity to discuss the importance of embracing both the similarities and differences we share, and how we can learn new things from our friends. In our maths lessons, we've been exploring our counting skills by not only counting visible items but also counting things we can not see, like sounds. We are practising counting accurately and deciding which counting methods are most effective in different scenarios. Additionally, we've been taking a closer look at our facial features. Using mirrors, we attempted to draw our own faces, incorporating all the details we could observe.


